The residents of Louisiana never know what will attack them next: floods, hurricanes, even monstrous swamp rats. Gigantic orange-toothed nutria are eating up the coastal wetlands, destroying the landscape, and threatening the very existence of the human population. But the people who have lived here for generations are not the type of folks who let their land—and their livelihoods—recede into the Gulf without a fight.
