Arts & Artists Celebrated this September

SHERIDAN — Arts organizations in and around Sheridan will gather September 10 thru 14 to offer the Celebrate the Arts Festival. In its fourth consecutive year, Celebrate the Arts is a festival celebrating local art, artists and organizations who help make Sheridan and the surrounding area an artistic destination. Participating organizations will present events throughout the course of the festival culminating in an artist reception at SAGE Community Arts September 14.

Kendra Heimbuck, Executive Director of SAGE Community Arts and chair of the Celebrate the Arts Committee says, “it’s exciting to be able offer the festival this year especially with the challenges our community is facing. We hope this can be an inspiring and unifying event for all who participate.”

The festival opens on Thursday, September 10 at The Edward A. Whitney Gallery at the Whitney Center for the Arts with an artist talk and reception by local ceramics artist Rod Dugall at 4pm. On Friday, September 11 the WYO Theater presents the WYOMericana Caravan at 7:30pm featuring local acts from around the state. The festival continues Saturday, September 12 at 9am with the Bighorn Rendezvous Quick Draw at The Brinton Museum followed by a 7pm recital by local flautist and professor, Rachel Bergman at Kinnison Hall at Whitney Center for the Arts. On Sunday, September 13 visitors can enjoy “an afternoon in Art Alley” with live music, dance performances and artist demonstrations. The street festival will be held from 2pm to 6pm on Brundage Street between Main and Brooks and is free to the public. And on Monday, September 14, SAGE Community Arts presents an artist talk and book signing with sculpture artist Chris Navarro at 4:30pm. Throughout the festival paintings and sculpture will be on display throughout downtown Sheridan and Ucross will offer an exhibit from Jennifer Reifsneider and Martha Tuttle entitled ENTWINED Monday – Friday.
